Dr. Harvey provides training and consultation on deafness/hearing loss, vicarious trauma and mental health issues. In addition to a private practice in Framingham, Massachusetts, he is an adjunct faculty at Boston University and a consultant faculty at Pennsylvania College of Optometry, School of Audiology, where he teaches on-line

courses relating to the psychosocial aspects of hearing loss. Dr. Harvey writes a regular column, "What's On Your Mind?", in *Hearing Loss*, the journal for Hearing Loss Association of America.



In addition to over 40 articles, his publications include *The Odyssey of Hearing Loss: Tales of Triumph*.; *Psychotherapy with Deaf and Hard of Hearing Persons: A Systemic Model* (second addition), and a co-edited book entitled *Culturally Affirmative Psychotherapy with Deaf Persons*. His most recent book is *Listen with the Heart: Relationships and Hearing Loss*.

Dr. Harvey is Co-Director of a private, non-profit organization, Dialogue Toward Change, dedicated to providing research, training and consultation services to alleviate the potentially negative impact of witnessing oppression.
