What is Visual Phonics?

Visual Phonics was developed in 1982 and is a system that uses 45 Easy hand cues and written symbols as a way to make sounds of the spoken language visible to students, which helps develop phonemic awareness, speech productions and reading skills.

Visual Phonics *is not* a communication methods, but *is* a multi-sensory, interactive system which can be used with any reading curriculum.

Visual Phonics can be used with ALL students who are struggling to read. It helps students "see" and internalize English sounds and how they map onto English letters and onto words.
